The upper part of the style really consists of two half-round stigmatic arms which are now pressed closely together, their entire surface covered with downy points. At present it serves as a plug to the staminal tube, and as the anthers shed their pollen before the stigmas expand, the tube is filled with pollen. Then the style begins to lengthen, and the unripe stigmas are pushed like a brush up the tube, and the pollen is piled up at the mouth of the flower,...
